See beetles, butterflies and bugs made with wire, organza, real beetle wings and fine embroidery that are so life like they literally jump out of the frame. Flowers that are 3 dimensional with minuscule insects that look ready to crawl away. Crochet items made with fine crochet cotton that took months, sometimes more than a year to make.

Both Jan and Cath have been successful in gaining the Grand Champion of the Wagga Wagga Show in the Various Sections from 2008 to 2013. With other Champion pieces all on show in this Exhibition.

Cath and Jan have received both formal training at TAFE and informal training from family members and other likeminded people, they have attended classes held in many different locations including here at Wagga. They both enjoy self-teaching themselves with the challenge of attempting to do things that are "a little bit different".
